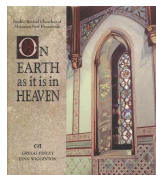

historian, now retired, who taught at St. Stephen's University and Atlantic Baptist College. **Lynn Wigginton** - is a graduate of Mount Allison University's Department of Fine Arts. Painting in the realist tradition, she captures the suggestive shape of the Gothic Revival with intricacy and detail.
